Update from the Treasurer

As mentioned by Brian in his April President's Message, the Club has secured a special once-off grant from the QLD Government for \$23,500 from a Fund they call the Gambling Community Benefit Fund. The funds are intended to refresh most of our old archaic club assets which have long been written off.

To give you more information, there are five areas where we have received funding:

By way of an update:

- We have completed the research and purchased the new PA System
- The Projector and Screen has also been purchased we are awaiting delivery of the Screen which is on back-order.
- The Committee has decided to engage our current Website consultant Kim Senior from Kindlevision to rebuild our website and David Grugeon and I have commenced a project to complete this task.
- We have done the homework on the Laptops and would like to spend some of these funds on a club printer in lieu of some of the software packages. We need to apply to the fund managers for a variation to be able to do this.
- We have decided on the style of banners to be purchased and expect to place the order and approve the artwork in the coming weeks.

We are required to 'acquit' the funds by 1st August or apply for an extension if we need more time to find and buy the items we need. I will continue to keep you updated on our Grant spending.

In other financial news, I'm pleased to advise the following financial results for the events we have conducted this year:

- AGM 2024 Excess of Expenses over Income of \$412
- Camp 2024 Excess of Income over Expenses of \$5,010
- Have-a-Chat Excess of Income over Expenses of \$644

The current Bank Balance at the end of June stood at \$36,810.50 including the grant money or \$13,302.50 excluding it.
